- 2. The trial of this matter is set to commence on November 27, 2018.
- 3. Plaintiff USA further advises that it will not pursue the prosecution of the Defendants Ignjatov and Hristovski and will be moving to dismiss the First Superseding Indictment and prior Indictment filed against these two defendants. However, Plaintiff USA will not immediately do so in order to maintain the jurisdiction of the Court so that Plaintiff may be heard on a motion it intends to bring seeking an amendment to the Court's written order granting suppression. Plaintiff USA maintains that this amendment will not affect the Court's decision to grant the defendants' motion to suppress evidence.
- 4. The parties agree that fairness requires that the government's intention to seek that amendment should not delay the defendants' forthwith release from custody.
- 5. The Plaintiff USA shall return defendants' Ignjatov's and Hristovski's passports, wallets and their contents seized at the time of their arrest to them so that they may voluntarily leave the United States to return to their homes in Canada.
- 6. The parties agree that there is no need for any bond or pretrial release conditions.
- 7. The parties agree that any prior orders of detention as to Defendants'
